That the General Election is called to be held throughout the county of Doña Ana and precincts thereof on November 8, 2022; and

That the General Election shall be applicable to elect candidates for the following offices:

SUPREME COURT RETENTION

Shall MICHAEL E VIGIL be retained as Justice of the Supreme Court Position 1?

COURT OF APPEALS RETENTION

Shall JANE B YOHALEM be retained as Judge of the Court of Appeals?

That the General Election shall be applicable to vote for or against the following Statewide Constitutional Amendments:

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT 1

Proposing an amendment to article 12, section 7 of the Constitution of New Mexico to provide for additional annual distributions of the permanent school fund for enhanced instruction for students at risk of failure, extending the school year, teacher compensation and early childhood education; requiring congressional approval for distributions for early childhood education.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT 2

Proposing to amend article 9, section 14 of the Constitution of New Mexico to allow public investment to provide access to essential household services, including internet, energy, water, wastewater and other similar services as provided by law, upon the enactment of general implementing legislation by a majority vote of the members elected to each house of the legislature.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT 3

Proposing to amend article 6, section 35 of the Constitution of New Mexico to provide that an appointed judge serve at least one year before a general election is held for the office to which the judge was appointed.

That the General Election shall be applicable to vote for or against the following Statewide General Obligation Bonds:

STATEWIDE BOND QUESTION 1

The 2022 capital projects general obligation bond act authorizes the issuance and sale of senior citizen facility improvement, construction and equipment acquisition bonds. Shall the state be authorized to issue general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed twenty-four million four hundred seventy thousand dollars (\$24,470,000) to make capital expenditures for certain senior citizen facility improvement, construction and equipment acquisition projects and provide for a general property tax imposition and levy for the payment of principal of, interest on and expenses incurred in connection with the issuance of the bonds and the collection of the tax as permitted by law?

STATEWIDE BOND QUESTION 2

The 2022 capital projects general obligation bond act authorizes the issuance and sale of library acquisition bonds. Shall the state be authorized to issue general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed nineteen million two hundred sixty-six thousand dollars (\$19,266,000) to make capital expenditures for academic, public school, tribal and public library resource acquisitions and provide for a general property tax imposition and levy for the payment of principal of, interest on and expenses incurred in connection with the issuance of the bonds and the collection of the tax as permitted by law?

STATEWIDE BOND QUESTION 3

The 2022 capital projects general obligation bond act authorizes the issuance and sale of higher education, special schools and tribal schools capital improvement and acquisition bonds. Shall the state be authorized to issue general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed two hundred fifteen million nine hundred eighty-six thousand dollars (\$215,986,000) to make capital expenditures for certain higher education, special schools and tribal schools capital improvements and acquisitions and provide for a general property tax imposition and levy for the payment of principal of, interest on and expenses incurred in connection with the issuance of the bonds and the collection of the tax as permitted by law?

That the General Election shall be applicable to vote for or against the following General Obligation Bonds pertaining to the City of Las Cruces:

CITY of LAS CRUCES BOND QUESTION 1

Shall the City of Las Cruces issue general obligation bonds, payable from property taxes, in an amount up to \$10,000,000 to acquire, plan, design, construct, and equip a new fire station facility (North of US Highway 70 and East of Interstate 25), including acquisition of necessary land?

CITY of LAS CRUCES BOND QUESTION 2

Shall the City of Las Cruces issue general obligation bonds, payable from property taxes, in an amount up to \$5,000,000 to acquire, plan, design, construct, and equip the regional community recreation facility known as East Mesa Public Recreation Complex, including acquisition of necessary land?

CITY of LAS CRUCES BOND QUESTION 3

Shall the City of Las Cruces issue general obligation bonds, payable from property taxes, in an amount up to \$6,000,000, and placed into the Affordable Housing Trust Fund, to provide resources to plan, design, construct, acquire, and preserve housing affordable for low to moderate income households, including acquisition of necessary land?

CITY of LAS CRUCES BOND QUESTION 4

Shall the City of Las Cruces issue general obligation bonds, payable from property taxes, in an amount up to \$2,000,000 to renovate and improve existing parks and recreational facilities?

That the General Election shall be applicable to vote for or against the following General Obligation Bonds pertaining to the City of Sunland Park:

CITY of SUNLAND PARK BOND QUESTION 1

Shall the City of Sunland Park issue general obligation bonds, payable from property taxes, in an amount up to \$4,000,000 for construction of a regional recreation center, upgrade current parks, upgrade City Library and construction of a second library?

CITY of SUNLAND PARK BOND QUESTION 2

Shall the City of Sunland Park issue general obligation bonds, payable from property taxes, in an amount up to \$4,000,000 for design, construction of new public safety complex, the purchase of new fire ladder truck and other needed city vehicles?

CITY of SUNLAND PARK BOND QUESTION 3

Shall the City of Sunland Park issue general obligation bonds, payable from property taxes, in an amount up to \$4,000,000 for work on existing roads, new construction of roadways (see attachment "A") and wastewater infrastructure on?

FEDERAL ABSENTEE

September 23, 2022 through November 8, 2022

Federal applications for an absentee ballot must be received by the County Clerk on or before November 3, 2022.

Mailing of Federal Ballots begins September 23, 2022.

Federal Absentee Ballots must be received by the County Clerk no later than November 8, 2022 at 7:00 pm.

ABSENTEE

October 11, 2022 through November 8, 2022

Applications for an absentee ballot must be received by the County Clerk on or before November 3, 2022.

Mailing of absentee ballots begins October 11, 2022.

Absentee ballots must be received by the County Clerk no later than November 8, 2022 at 7:00 pm.

Absentee ballots may be returned by mail or in person, by the following individuals: the voter, a member of the voter's immediate family, or a voter's caregiver. Per state statute, "immediate family" is defined as a spouse, children, parents, or siblings of the voter. There is a space on the ballot envelope where a person returning an envelope must indicate their relationship to the voter.

Processing of absentee ballots will take place at the Doña Ana County Clerk's Bureau of Elections Warehouse located at 2480 Lakeside Dr., Las Cruces, NM 88007.

SECURED CONTAINER BALLOT BOXES

The Doña Ana County Clerk's Office will have 24-hour, video-monitored secured containers available to voters for the return of absentee ballots during the 2022 General Election.

Collections from the containers will be conducted in compliance with state statute and state administrative code once in a 24 hour period, beginning October 12, 2022.
